acknowledged, the parties of the first part have bargained and sold and by these presents do hereby bargain, sell and convey unto the said Dunlap & Millo, Incorporated, its successors and assigns, the following described lots or parcels of land situate, lying and being in Wadesboro Township, Anson County, North Carolina and more particularly described as follows, to-wit:
