Trealer and for the further Consideration of the sum of one Dollar in hand paid the said John Trealer by the said John H. Trealer, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, the said John Trealer hath bargained, sold, conveyed, aliened and covenanted to stand seised to the use of and by these presents doth bargain sell, convey, alien and covenant to stand seised to the use of the said John H.
