THIS DEED, made this, the 23rd day of December, 1920, by George Singleton and Rue sell Murray, Directors and Trustees of the Wadesboro Manufacturing Company, parties of the first part, to the Singleton Silk Manufacturing Company, a comporation created by and organized under the laws of the State of New Jersey, party of the second part WIIN BESBERH: THAT WHEREAS, the Wadesboro Manufacturing Company was duly inporporated under the laws of the State of North Carolina, on the 7th day of July, 1888, having a corporate existence for a period of thirty (30) years; and whereas, said corporate existence has expired; and whereas, at and before the expiration of said charter, George Singleton and Russell Murray were the enryiving Directors of he Wadesboro Manufacturing Company, duly elected and acting as such; and whereas, pon the expiration of the charter wf aforesaid said surviving Directors become the rustees of the Wadesboro Manufacturing Company, and as such Directors and Trustees re enthorized and empowered under the 1sms of the State of North Carolina to settle he affairs, collect the outstanding debts and sell and convey all the real property I the Wadesboro Manufacturing Company; and whereas, the parties of the first part, s such Directors and Trustees, pursuant to the authority aforesaid, have sold to the ingleton Silk Manufacturing Company all the property hereinafter described, and desire to convey title thereto. - NOW. THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises, and the further consideration of the sum of One (\$1.00)Dollar, and other valuable considerations paid by the party of the second part to the said parties of the first part, the receipt and payment of which is hereby acknowledged, the said parties of the first part have bargained, sold, and by these presents, do hereby bargain, sell, alien and convey unto the Singleton Silk Manufacturing Company, and Ita successors, subject to the reservations bereinafter made, the following tract of land, situated in Wadesboro rownship. Amson County. North Carolina, and more particularly described as follows, to-wit: BEGINNING at a white oak and black gum, the beginning corner of a tract of land granted to William Thomas (Son of Philemon), and runs thence 5. 50 E. 7.50 chains to a corner in a road, two black gome and sweet gome, ptra., thence S. IS chains to a stake, white oak and small pine ptrs.; thouce N. 16 chains to a stake, two small old field pine ptre.; thence west 24.50 chains to the fourth line of Thomas Wades' one hundred and fifty sore survey, and then with said line S. 22 R. 12 chs. to the beginning, containing Thirty-Four (34) acres, more or less.
