STATE OF NORTH CAROLINA,

ANSON COUNTY.

THIS DEED, made this the 21st day of May, 1927, by Sallie H. Uren, and her husband, C. C. Uren, parties of the first part, to T. L. Huntley, party of the second part, all parties being of Anson County, State of North Carolina,

WITNESSETH: THAT THE SAID PARTIES OF THE FIRST PART, for and in consideration of the sum of One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars, and other valuable considerations to them in hand paid by the said party of the second part, the receipt and payment of which is hereby acknowledged, have bargained and sold, and by these presents do hereby bargain, sell and convey to the said T. L. Huntley, his heirs and assigns, the following described tract of land situated in Gullledge Township, Anson County, State of North Carolina, to-wit:

BEGINNING at a pine by a pine stump, pointers, about Huntley's line N. 87 W. 15 chs., to a stake by a bunch of bay trees, Huntley's other corner; then with a new line known as the base line made to divide the whole tract into two parts, N. 18 $\frac{1}{2}$ W. 28.90 chs., to a stake in said base line, small pine and a. C. ptra.; then with the line of Lot No. 2, N. 79 E. 32.80 chs., to a stake in J. J. Moore, dead, line, sweetgum pine and poplar ptra., second corner of Lot No. 2; then with said Moore's line S. 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ E. 11 chs., to his other corner stake on N. W. bank of ditch, one sweetgum, one large and two small pine ptra.; then S. 22 W. with Moore's other line 25.30 chs., to the beginning, containing about 81 $\frac{1}{2}$ acres.

The same being the tract of land conveyed by Zilpha Emma Flake Briley and husband, Charlie Briley, and others, to Sallie H. Uren by deed dated October 7, 1925, and recorded in Deed Book 65, page 415, in the office of the Register of Deeds for Anson County, and also being the same name tract of land in and to which Ida Flake Harley and husband, D. Uren their interest in said tract of land by deed dated October 7, 1925, and recorded in Deed Book 65, page 417, in the office of the Register of Deeds for Anson County, reference being hereby expressly made to both of said deeds for a more particular de-
